### [Auditing a Class](#)

A person who meets the admission requirements may, with the consent of the division dean and instructor, enroll in a credit course as a noncredit student. An audit provides the student the opportunity to attend a credit class without receiving a transcribed grade; you may attend class, but you will not receive a final grade or credit for the course. An instructor may give you exams if the instructor determines the examination is an essential component of the learning process.

An audit request will not be considered until the first day the class meets. A student may not register for a credit class and then change to an audit status. A student may not change from an audit status to credit status after the term certification date. **Not all classes may be audited, such as computer and science classes.** An audit request will not be considered after the state certification date.

The cost for auditing a class is the same as taking the class for credit and is based on the student's residency status, which is determined by the Admissions and Student Records Office. Audit forms are available in the Admissions and Student Records Office located in Thunderduck Hall, T-170.
