## Total Re-Integration Program for adults with brain injuries

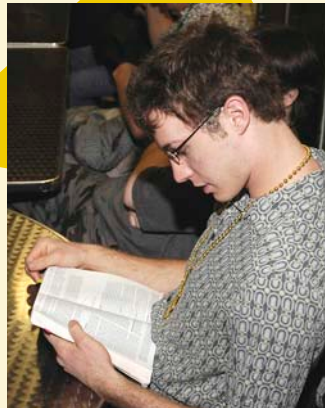


The HEATH Resource Center at George Washington University states that “higher education offers significant opportunities for cognitive stimulation and age appropriate socializing opportunities that enable a person with a brain injury to re-connect with the world, rediscover abilities, understand new limitations while developing compensatory strategies, and regain confidence and self-esteem.” The TRI Program has been doing just that since its inception.

Brain Injury is the leading cause of death and disability in children and young adults. The road to recovery has been described as a long journey. Richland College’s TRI Program seeks to make the journey smooth by serving students with brain injuries who are at various levels of physical, cognitive, and emotional recovery, and who have completed acute medical treatment.

TRI is an educational experience designed specifically for those students who have sustained a brain injury after the age of 13. The TRI Program offers opportunities for cognitive stimulation and socialization allowing students to re-connect with the world, while building academic skills, confidence, and self-esteem.

The curriculum includes a full spectrum of classes aiming to provide a balanced, comprehensive program of instruction. Classes focus on improving concentration, retention, organization, and communication skills.
