Use these electronic resources to locate periodical articles, newspaper articles, statistics, reports, and other useful information.

Academic Search Complete 1985 - present

A multi-disciplinary periodical database containing full-text articles from 4,600 scholarly and popular publications and indexing and abstracts for 8,000+ journals and magazines. Coverage includes the social sciences, humanities, education, sciences, engineering, language and linguistics, arts and literature, medical sciences, and ethnic studies.

**Business Source Complete 1965 – present

The most important source of business and economics periodical articles. Provides full-text articles for more than 8,500 scholarly business journals and other sources, including full-text for more than 1,100 peer-reviewed business publications. Updated daily.

CQ Researcher

Explores a single "hot" issue in the news in depth on such topics as Privatizing Government Services, Governing Washington, D.C., Faith-Based Initiatives, and Civil Liberties in Wartime. 44 reports are produced each year.

Dallas Morning News

Complete full text from 1984 to the present. The **Historical Archive** has full text from 1855-1977.

eLibrary

Resources from seven different media types: TV/radio transcripts, magazines, newspapers, reference books, pictures, maps, and streaming audio and video.

Facts.com

Brings together complete content from the *Facts On File World News Digest* since 1940 and selected content from six other core reference databases as well as special features like Country Profiles, Issues & Controversies, Historic Documents, World Heads of State and World Leaders, and Issues in the News which deals with a diverse listing of topics from abortion to voting machines

Financial Times

Current present Full-text articles from the well known English financial newspaper.

InfoTrac Newspapers

Growing collection of over 100 newspapers from the U.S. and around the world. Search results are displayed by newspaper-sections which facilitates finding editorials.

Mergent Online

A comprehensive suite of authoritative financial information, providing a fully searchable database of 15,000 U.S. public companies listed on the NYSE, AMEX and NASDAQ exchanges..

New Dictionary of the History of Ideas

This e-book is the first revision in 30 years of the classic Dictionary of the History of Ideas, one of the most important reference works published on "what we think" -- philosophical and theoretical concepts, historical, scientific, social, and critical issues, etc.

New York Times

A daily newspaper considered to be the "official" U.S. newspaper because it publishes the complete text of important documents, speeches and presidential press conferences. Has full text from 1999 to date. *The Historical New York Times* has full text back to 1851.

Opposing Viewpoints Resource Center

Current events issues and controversies. Gives facts as well as the arguments of each topic's proponents and detractors. Nearly all topics have governmental or political implications. Very current.

Pro & Con Online

Offers significant and authoritative viewpoints on issues before Congress, the Supreme Court and other international forums. Includes the online versions of Congressional Digest, Supreme Court Debates, and International Debates.

Reference Universe

A detailed index to subject encyclopedias and other authoritative works frequently found on the reference shelves of libraries. The succinct overviews provided by subject encyclopedias are often recommended by librarians as a first stop in research. The open book icon before the entry in the results list tells you the book is owned by a DCCC campus library. Clicking that icon opens up a direct link to the Library Catalog where you can access the campus and call number.

Regional Business News

Regional Business News incorporates 75 business journals, newspapers and newswires covering all metropolitan and rural areas within the United States. Includes Fort Worth Business Press but not Dallas Fort Worth Business Journal. Also has many transcripts from business and economic television news shows. Updated daily.

Statesman's Yearbook Online

Contains up-to-date information on every country of the world. Includes historical background, constitution, government, defense, international relations, economy and social institutions. It also provides extensive further reading lists and web links for further research.

Thomas Register of Manufacturers

Database of over 72,000 product and service headings, 170,000 companies, 135,415 trademark and brand names and 785,543 CAD drawings. This database provides links to more than 7,782 online catalogs or supplier web sites. These links are both product and company specific. This is a free database.

HOW TO ACCESS DATABASES FROM THE RICHLAND COLLEGE LIBRARY WEB SITE

<http://www.rlc.dcccd.edu/library/index.htm> (click on either “Articles Online” or “Find Articles in Databases.”). Then use the alphabet to locate the specific database you want to use. Click on the title link. You will be prompted to enter your name and your student ID number to access the database.

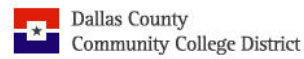
