Schools Where Rising Star Students May be Recruited

NOTE: Recruiters may recruit students from these high schools because these students:

- (1) will graduate from a high school on the approved list of eligible high schools;
- (2) meet the qualifications of having a B or better grade point average (must be 80.00 or above on a 100 point grade scale); and
- (3) have a class ranking as provided on the home high school transcript.

HOWEVER, STUDENTS FROM THESE SCHOOLS MUST INDICATE ON THEIR APPLICATION THAT THEY WILL GRADUATE FROM THE HOME SCHOOL AND THEY SHOULD NAME THAT SCHOOL. STUDENTS LISTING ANY OF THESE SCHOOLS AS THE SCHOOL FROM WHICH THEY WILL GRADUATE WILL AUTOMATICALLY BE CONSIDERED SCHOOL INELIGIBLE.
